s the Summer activities seemingly take over the life of the people in the church, and the effects of which spill over into the fall activities and then the winter activities, pretty soon time has flown by and some seem to have estranged themselves from gathering with brothers and sisters in Christ to receive the gifts of God, and to rejoice with and be encouraged by their fellowship and love.

The church seems to decline ever so slowly from year to year, almost without notice. But some do notice, and they wonder what can be done to change things, to stem the tide of people flowing out of the church instead of in. We like God want "all men to be saved and come to a knowledge of the truth" (1 Tim. 2:4).

The question remains, Why? What drives us to think, How do we reach out? And To whom do we reach out? Is it because we can't bear the thought of people going to hell? Or is it because we are more concerned about ourselves? Do we love our neighbor for his sake or are we using our neighbor for our sake?

No doubt the state of the church is a concern for us, and it causes us to be fearful of the future and to to be insecure about our status. This insecurity and fear stems from false expectations of what "Church" is supposed to look like. Our sinful nature desires that our church should look like the mega church, or at least like it did back in the day when there was standing room only. Back in the day there were activities at church several days and nights of the week. We think the church should be like it was in Acts 2 where 3,000 were converted in one day. But is that how Jesus describes the church? Jesus gives us a clue in John 3, when he says, "And this is the judgment: the Light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil." (v. 19)

The church has the light of Christ. The church's life is Christ's life, and her glory is Christ's glory. And while there is glory in the resurrected Christ, John's Gospel speaks more about the Glory of Christ seen as he hangs upon the cross, in his being poor and lowly in heart. As with Christ so also his church will suffer and be despised, poor and lowly in heart. This means that we keep our place under God's control, always holding others in greater esteem than ourselves as we speak about Christ to our neighbors. Our confession is that of Peter in Matt. 16, "I will build my church (on the confession, Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God) and the gates of hell will not prevail against it." (v. 18)

The church will always stand until Christ returns. There will always be a church. While many churches may close their doors, we as the body of Christ continue to witness Christ as the Son of God and Savior of the world through his passion, death, and resurrection. This is what we have to offer the world darkened by sin. Our message is the only light that brings hope in a sin-darkened world, the only hope in a hopeless world. Rejoice that you are saved and remain faithful to the Lord and do what is natural, reach out to those who are lost or maybe are taking their time to get back into the fellowship. Share the hope! Share the Love! Share the Good News!

The meeting was called to order at 9:05 a.m. by First Vice President, Rick Gipp. A motion was made by Cheryl Jawort and seconded by Janet Strohbusch to approve the agenda. Motion carried. Dear Friends

Greetings once again, though I notice that we are more than half-way through the month already before I am getting this out! How does that happen?! We are doing well. Last month we ended up going to the coast of Namibia to visit the dentist and to get a radiator repaired for one of our vehicles. The trip was a long one because we had to take Tim's vehicle which, though a very good work vehicle, does not reach highway speeds. This meant that we got to enjoy camping two nights each way instead of the usual one. Our dental visits went really well and we are so thankful to have access to great care. During the visit it was decided that one of Aaron's wisdom teeth should come out: poor Aaron was not overly happy about this, but the dentist had it out within seven minutes and with very little trauma as Aaron had no discernible swelling.

Work-wise Tim and Splash have finished the 'homework' given to them by the typesetter and they are now working on more spell-checking. It is a long, tedious process, but Tim is hoping they will finish with this by the end of this week. Then we wait to hear from the typesetter if something else needs to be done. We are really, really, really hoping that all typesetting will be done by mid-July and we can send everything off to the printer before we leave for furlough.

Otherwise, the Khwe community has decided that they want to have a full Bible translation, and they want to continue the translation process after this panoramic Bible has been finished. We are thrilled that they want all of God's Word in their language; when we started this project we weren't sure the community really wanted the Bible or if they were just seeing what they could get 'for free.' However, certain parts of the community at least seem committed to a full translation. But it is a real challenge for people who don't look to the future, or plan for it, to take on a project like this which will take many resources and last many years.

There have been--and will continue to be--some real growing pains. The Advisory Committee for the translation project is struggling a bit with learning what outside agencies expect of them and how to get things accomplished. There is a steep learning curve, so we pray for God's guidance and His wisdom as they start laying the framework for moving forward on their own.
