To the Saints

s part of the Sermon on the mount—Matthew 57 Jesus says, "consider the Lillies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these." (6:28-29)

Last month I mentioned the state of the church in the world, or at least in America, and stressed that the church has the light of Christ. The church's life is Christ's life, and her glory is Christ's glory. This month I want to consider the beauty of the Word, because the Word of God is the most beautiful treasure we have on earth. Where is the Word of God most beautiful and prominent than in the Divine Service, since 'the Divine Service is heaven on earth?' The Word of God is the one thing needful for us Christians, as Jesus points out to Martha in Luke 10:38-42 when Mary sat at the feet of Jesus to listen to the Word of God in stead of worrying about getting things ready for all the people who gathered together.

The flowers that are free for the picking are more beautiful than the wealthiest, wisest man who ever lived. By these words Jesus teaches us that real beauty is a free gift of God. "Beauty is in the eye of the beholder" but is objective. If heaven, being in the presence of God, is the most beautiful place then the Divine Service is heaven on earth. The Divine Service does highlight the beauty of the Word of God. For example; We sing the Kyrie, "Lord have Mercy," as if the Word of God is standing right there before us to receive our prayers—because he is. We sing the Gloria in Excelsis with the angels, "Glory to God in the highest," as if we are celebrating the incarnation of our Lord every Sunday—because we are! We stand for the Holy Gospel as if appearing before the throne of a great king to hear his proclamation. And that is exactly what is happening. We sing the Sactus, the song the angels sing around the throne of God, "Holy, Holy, Holy," because the Holy one of God deigns to dwell with us in the sacrament of the Altar. We sing the Agnus Dei, praying

to the Lamb of God, directing our eyes not up into the stratosphere or to the backs of our eyelids, but at the bread and wine which are Christ's Body and Blood. We sing the Nunc Dimittis with Simeon, "Lord lettest thou they servant depart in peace," because like Simeon, we have heard the promise and seen the Lord's salvation.

We see the things that are outwardly beautiful to our fallen nature, things that we desire. Solomon's beauty was outward for the people to see. Jesus speaks about how the Lillies grow. It is by the word of God that the flowers grow and fade. They are beautiful because it is the work of God. So also in the Divine Service. The Divine Service is not beautiful because we get to sing toe-tappin' songs, and make "heartfelt confessions" to God, or see images displayed on a screen from somewhere we've never been or heard of. The beauty of the Divine Service is in the things God does, The words God speaks to us, like actually forgiving the sins we can't seem to let go of because that is what love does. The beauty of the Divine Service is seen in the images formed in the mind of the hearer as the Word of God is read. And the beauty of the Divine Service is in the gathering of the believers around the Altar of God to see with their eyes and touch with their hands and taste with their mouths that the Lord is Good, that the Lord is GOD. I guess that real beauty is the free gift of God.


