To the Saints

"Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast what is good. Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality." (Rom. 12:9-13)

hen we want to talk about doing mission work, when we want to talk about reaching out to others, when we want to talk about how we should, can, do proclaiming the "Gospel" these verses help us to know what to do but not necessarily the how or the why. The 'how and why' is a whole other dimension, which might simply be distilled down to the two word phrase, "act naturally." Act naturally as a Christian. I suggest that we begin with taking Jesus at his word in Matthew 11:29, "Take my yoke upon you and "Learn from me" for I am gentle and humble in heart." If we would only learn from Christ what it means to be gentle and humble, what it means to be concerned for the eternal salvation of others, what it means to truly believe that we are sinners from the moment of our conception but by the grace of God we are forgiven of all our sins on account of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, then acting naturally as a Christian is seen by the people of the world as being the very things Paul lists. The things Paul lists are not a prescription of what to do in order to be a good Christian. Paul is actually describing the life of the Christian. These are the things they do without knowing it. It is just who they are, and you can spot them a mile away.

Peter writes something similar with these words. "The end of all things is at hand; therefore, be self-controlled and sober-minded for the sake of your prayers. Above all, keep loving one another, since love covers a multitude of sins. Show hospitality to one another without grumbling. As each has received a gift, use it to serve another as good stewards of God's varied gifts." (1 Peter 4:7-10)

More often than not, this happens in people who are immersed in the Word of God; who are always reading God's Word, who always pray for all people—even people they may not like, who spend time doing devotions and review their catechism, etc.; but then, you don't immerse yourself in God's Word except because you want see that your sins are not new, just sins for which God mourns, and that you need to hear how God has forgiven you just like he has forgiven all those before you. Believing that the Love of God in Christ Jesus has covered the multitude of our sins releases us from our bondage to the law, allowing us to freely live as redeemed children of God who love one another, forgiving each other all the time everyday, showing hospitality to others without grumbling. In other words, "acting naturally" as Children of God, brothers and sisters in Christ, whose hope in our own resurrection one day. This good news is not something to be guarded and kept secret, but lived out and shared. The hospitality we are to share, we might say, is the very same hospitality that God has shown to us. If we want to know what it means to show hospitality to others, we need only look to our own Father in heaven to see the varied ways in which he shows us what hospitality is in his Word. In His Word, in Jesus, we learn that hospitality is being gentle and humble in heart.


