To the Saints

December 2024

s we conclude this year. Wait, as we begin this new church year, looking forward to the return of Jesus Christ even as we celebrate his birth into this world, to bring life to this fallen and dying world of his creating, I encourage you through a selection of passages from Paul's letters to the churches; remember who you are and who God is; "To those in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints." "To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints together with those who in every place call upon the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours." "To the churches in Galatia," "To the saints who are in Ephesus, and are faithful in Christ Jesus." "To all the saints in Christ Jesus who are at Philippi, with the overseers and deacons." To the Saints and faithful brothers in Christ at Colossae." "To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." (Romans. 1:7, 1 Corinthians. 1:2, Galatians 1:2, Ephesians 1:1, Philippians 1:1, Colossians 1:2, 1 Thessalonians 1:1)

As the editor notes in this month's edition of the Lutheran Witness, "At the heart of the themes this year is the truth that Christians live in a community that is given from above. We are the Body of Christ, and as such, He is our head (1 Cor. 12:12-31). He gives us community when he incorporates us into His Body through the waters of Holy Baptism."

"Draw near to God and He will draw near to you" (James 4:8) In each of Paul's letters, he begins his introduction by reminding the people that they are saints, they are holy, they are a part of the Body of Christ by virtue of their baptism. Now they are different from the rest of the world in which they have grown up and lived. Because they are part of the body of Christ they necessarily desire to be attached to the rest of the body because that is

where they have life. The life they have is in the word of God as it is shared, and in the fellowship of the saints who have the same Word in common with the rest of the congregation. This is important because you need to have the Word of God in you if you are going to share that Word with those who are still in the darkness of the world.

I realize that many of you already spend time in the God's Word, this is for those who do not. I exhort you to invest in those things that will assist you in your daily walking together in the Lord.

A couple of resources to help read the Bible in a more manageable way, are:

"Today's light Devotional Bible" This covers about two chapters per day and includes a short devotion at the end pertaining to what was read. You would read through the Bible in about two years.

"Treasury of Daily Prayer" offers the daily Bible reading schedule listed in the Bulletin and in the Newsletter as well as a short reading from a church father, the confessions, or something about the holy day assigned by the church, a hymn verse, and a prayer.

If you are interested in either of these options to build on your daily devotions, please contact me and I will help you get started. "The peace of God which passes all understanding will keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus, Our Lord." (Philippians 4:7)
