The church—LCMS—publishes a number of different periodicals (Lutheran Witness, The Reporter, Lutherans Engage, etc...) that are designed to encourage you, the lay person, in your faith, as well as informing you about the church's stand on the relevant topics of the day affecting the church and her ministry in the world.

In the current issue of Lutherans Engage the World, are several short articles about various ministries of the church that are a reminder to you that God is still working mightily even in small congregations. The managing editor, Megan Mertz writes, "All around the world, there are Lutheran church workers and lay people who are serving quietly and humbly. They reach out to people who have just moved to a new place (pages 3 and 16). They care for families in turmoil (pages 14 and 20). They support fellow workers going through a crisis (page 15).

Where the devil seeks to isolate, God uses the loving service of his people to bring and share the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Thank you for reading this issue of Lutherans Engage the World and for your own acts of service, whatever they may be."

The first article in this issue is titled Ancient Mission, New Alliances: Two alliance Missionaries—pastors who come from LCMS partner churches—serve alongside the Lutheran Church in Spain. The focus is upon the confessional stand on the Word of God and its effect upon the people in Spain.

Another article titled "Equipped, Encouraged and Eager", begins, Dane Wolfgram says he is a director of Christian Education (DCE) today thanks, in part, to Youth Lead. As a high school student in the LCMS

North Dakota District, Wolfgram was invited to attend Youth Lead (then called Lutheran Youth Fellowship), a leadership training program of LCMS Youth Ministry that prepares teenagers to serve in their congregations and communities. A short time later, he was elected to serve on the youth Lead executive team. Now as a full-time DCE, he enjoys bringing his own youth to the annual training event."

Another article titled "A Center For Worship and Learning" tells you about how "On Sunday February 9, the bells echoed across the campus of Neema Lutheran College in Nyamira County, Kenya. The moment the College community had long prayed for was finally here: the dedication of the new Chapel of the Cross."

And finally, an article titled "A congregation older than the nation—the 360 year-old Evangelical Lutheran Church of St. Matthew in New York City has welcomed immigrants throughout the centuries.

The thing that becomes, or should be, self-evident is that the Gospel of Jesus Christ is not just a part of the life of these people; the gospel of Jesus Christ is their life. They not only believe in Jesus, but sometimes they actually suffer for his sake. They offer encouragement to you as they tell their stories about the way in which God works in them and through his Gospel message they speak to other people they encounter.



Tabor Council Meeting July 11, 2025

Call to Order: The meeting was officially opened by Dan, with attendees including Gary Kebschull, Scott Tennant, John Francis, Pastor Stoll, and Sonja Schultz. A defibrillator check was noted, handled by Scott.

Approval of Meeting Agenda: Sonja moved to approve the agenda with Scott seconding. The motion was carried unanimously. There were no additions, deletions, or edits.

Opening Devotion: Pastor led the devotion for the meeting.

Minutes Approval: John moved to approve the previous meeting's minutes, seconded by Scott, and passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report: John reported that a six-month financial report will be prepared for the upcoming joint meeting, potentially scheduled for October.

Old Business: Pastor reviewed issues with the parsonage basement and sump-pump purging, possibly linked to a new water unit installation. John recommended contacting B&E to investigate. The furnace filter was checked, and Pastor will verify again this week. The annual brat fry on the weekend of Independence Day was a success yielded a profit of \$930.43. A special thank you to Ron Lange, Janet Strohbusch, Nancy Krueger, Ev Charlson, and Ashlyn and Sonja Schultz for their time and efforts to make the day a success!

Short Term Plans: The October 5 Mission Festival will feature speaker Paul Steinhaus. A committee will be formed for event planning, with recommendations for a donation and potential schedule changes to accommodate Emmanuel joining the service at Tabor. A

potluck luncheon is suggested. Pastor will update the Ladies Aid.

New Business: Scott placed ant traps in the kitchen, and there were no additional updates from the Ladies Aid.

Next Council Meeting is scheduled for August 8, 2025, at 4:30 p.m.

Comments/Announcements: A parsonage walk-through with Elders was planned, with Pastor notifying Scott. Dan will be on vacation from July 16–20. Elder on Call Dan Felker is on call for July, Scott in August and Gary in September.

Motion to Adjourn Scott moved to adjourn, seconded by Sonja. The motion passed unanimously.
