To the Saints

September 2025

"Hear, O Israel, The Lord Our God, the Lord is one. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise." (Deuteronomy 6:4-6)

School and catechism and Bible study begin again this month, and it is important for all of us as parents and grandparents and all members of the congregation to remember who we are and who these children are to us. With the new year comes the development of habits and routines that will hopefully prayerfully, faithfully continue through the rest of their life and ours.

It is not just the children who are going back to school in September. The adults are supposed to be going back to school as well. It is called Bible Study, the time to study the number one most important book in the world and in history. By attending Bible study, you set the example of what adult Christians do because of the faith and trust they have in their God. Worship is important! Fellowship with Christians is important. Time spent in prayer is important, whether it is with other Christians or just by yourself. When you make your worship and devotional life visible to the rest of the world, especially the children, people see your good deeds and glorify God (1 Peter 2:12).

As I write this, I have just finished my devotional reading from 1 Chronicles 22:13-14, Where King David speaks these words of advice to his son Solomon for the building of the temple and as he begins his reign over all Israel, "Only may the Lord grant you discretion and understanding, that when he gives you charge over Israel you may keep the Law of the Lord your God. Then you will prosper If you are careful to observe the statutes and the rules that the Lord commanded Moses

for Israel. Be strong and courageous. Fear not; do not be dismayed." (Italicized for emphasis)

What are the statutes and commands of the Lord that Solomon is to follow? It is nothing more than how Jesus defines the greatest commandment, which is part of Verse 4 here. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might (Matt. 22:37). I have noticed, every time I read through the Bible that over and over again, (I have just begun noting the number of times) this is the advice given by God or one of his prophets or priests to one of Israel's leaders. The very first time God gives this command to the people is immediately after the Egyptian army was destroyed in the Red Sea (Exodus 15:26), before the giving of the 10 Commandments on Mt. Sinai.

It is about being diligent in seeking the Lord. Most often people will say that you need to sacrifice something in order to keep a daily devotional and prayer schedule. I believe God views this from the reverse/opposite perspective; you must sacrifice time with the Lord in order to do things your sinful nature desires to do. What does it mean to love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength? It is nothing else than being a baptized child of God, who died with Christ and has been raised to new life in Christ. It is a new life that worships the Lord no matter what they are doing. Always focusing on the Kingdom of God instead of the things of this world.

May we all live the new life of faith as the body of Christ knit together in His love and forgiveness, sharing with each other and teaching each other, especially the children.



Tabor Council Meeting August 8, 2025

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order with attendance by Gary Kebschull, Scott Tennant, John Francis, Pastor Stoll, Janet Strohbusch, and Sonja Schultz. Dan Felker initiated the session. Trustees confirmed that the defibrillator testing had been completed.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA: The agenda was reviewed with no additions, deletions, or edits. A motion to approve was made by Janet Strobusch and seconded by Scott Tennant, passing unanimously.

OPENING DEVOTIONS: Pastor Stoll led the opening devotions.

MINUTES FROM 7/11/2025 MEETING: The minutes from the previous meeting were reviewed and approved without edits. Janet Strobusch motioned, Gary Kebschull seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT: John reported that July broke even in terms of income versus expenses. Approval of the report was motioned by Scott Tennant and seconded by Sonja, passing unanimously. A sixmonth recap showed the church is on track to stay within budget.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Stoll shared updates including one funeral, no baptisms or weddings, and visits to all shut-ins. School starts in September, and Catechism will begin with one student from Tabor and one from Emmanuel. Elders will meet on August 24 at Emmanuel. Emmanuel hosted an ice cream social and plans to participate in the Labor Day parade. Pastor will be away from September 2–16, with Pastor Haag filling in. The report was approved unanimously following a motion by Scott Tennant and second by Gary Kebschull. Additional items included the Ushers' Report, planning for the October 5 Mission Festival with speaker Paul Steinhaus and lunch, altar committee challenges with volunteer shortages, and confirmation class updates.

OLD BUSINESS: The parsonage basement issue remains unresolved pending a walkthrough. Pastor will coordinate with Scott and B&E. The filter in the parsonage was replaced with no drywall residue found. Spectrum offered a new internet and phone package at \$120/month for three years, which was approved unanimously after a motion by Scott Tennant and second by Janet Strohbusch.

SHORT TERM PROJECT LIST: Plans for the Ladies Aid WML Fall Rally were discussed, including speaker Rev. Kleinschmidt, organist arrangements, and a donation drive for a women's shelter. The ant problem appears to be resolved thanks to traps.

NEW BUSINESS: Emmanuel proposed two dates for the Dual Parish Picnic August 23 or September 20 with a preference for September despite a conflict with the Suring Car Show. A letter from the Marine Corps Toys for Tots was shared and approved for support. The altar guild's volunteer shortage was discussed. Concerns about overcrowding in the counting room safe were raised; Janet and Scott will review its contents and consider transferring items to a fireproof cabinet.

Next Council Meeting: The next meeting is scheduled for September 12.

Comments and Announcements: John addressed the cleaning crew's habit of leaving chairs on tables; the issue will be corrected. He will also seek a quote for painting the white wall by the altar.

Elder on Call: Scott Tennant will serve as the elder on call for September.

Motion to Adjourn: The meeting was adjourned following a motion by Dan Felker, seconded by Scott Tennant, and approved unanimously.

Closing Prayer: Pastor Stoll concluded the meeting with a closing prayer.
